Column 1	Groups as they appear on the ballot papers
Column 2	Name of group or lead candidate and colour drawn from election material
Column 3	Name of lead candidate, aqua if they have signed the Declaration, BOLD indicates a sitting councillor
Column 4	Indicates whether the lead candidate of the group is a member of a party- this is from the statutory declaration that forms part of the Candidate Nomination form- this is buried on the NSW Electoral Commission website. The Declaration of Independents goes further by asking about past associations
Column 5	Indicates whether ANY candidate in the group is a member of a party-. The Declaration of Independents goes further by asking about past associations
Column 6,7,8+	Indicates how preferences have been identified on 'how to vote' documents issued by the groups. Party affiliations other than formal party endorsements are not made clear on the ballot forms. Columns 4 and 5 serve this purpose
